The Challenge

Just as the COVID-19 pandemic began spreading in early 2020, Vlado K., an avid swimmer and ping-pong player from Bulgaria, began experiencing neck pain that spread through his arms, wrists and fingers.

Vlado visited his doctor, who ordered computed tomography and magnetic resonance imaging exams. The images showed that Vlado had multiple conditions that can progress in severity without proper treatment.

His physician recommended a spinal fusion of the third and fourth cervical vertebrae

(C-3, C-4), but Vlado, who had previously been treated for cancer, wanted a second opinion.

"I wasn't completely sure whether or not this condition was a part of my previous cancer, and I wasn't sure that the solution I was offered by my doctor was actually the best for me," he says.

The Solution

Vlado's grandson, who lives in Ohio, recommended that he reach out to the world-renowned Cleveland Clinic for a second opinion. Given that he was in Bulgaria, and with pandemic travel restrictions in place, fortunately Vlado was able to take advantage of Virtual Second Opinions by Cleveland Clinic, which makes consultations with the institution's expert physicians available to patients around the world.

Within a few days, The Clinic obtained Vlado's medical records electronically and arranged for a video call between himself and neurosurgeon Edward Benzel, MD. Instead of a spinal fusion, Dr. Benzel recommended laminoplasty of the C-3 and C-4 vertebrae, a surgical procedure that could alleviate both the spinal stenosis and the cervical spondylotic myelopathy with a lower risk of complications than spinal fusion.

Vlado subsequently underwent the recommended surgery at a hospital close to his home and was able to make a complete recovery. "I had a very good surgeon," he says. "I can swim and play ping-pong with no pain in my arms, so it was a very good outcome, with the help of Cleveland Clinic."
